As a successful candidate your qualifications will include:

- Bachelor's Degree in Health Promotion, Social Services or Health-related Professions
- Minimum 2 years of experience working in Health Promotion capacity that includes the application of Traditional Aboriginal approaches to Health and Wellbeing
- Ability to develop, implement and evaluate performance indicators to evaluate programming
- Effective leadership, communication, group facilitation and interpersonal skills
- Ability to work both independently and within a team environment
- Sensitivity to the needs of a multi-cultural community and willingness to apply principles of Truth and Reconciliation in the work of a Health Promoter
- Class G Driver's Licence and use of a vehicle is required
- Ability to speak Cree or Ojibway is considered an asset
